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| | My name is Adriana Salgado, and I am a parent of two regional gifted center CPS students. The lack of bus service for my children has impacted my family severely. We live approximately nine miles away from the school. Therefore, to transport my kids it takes approximately 2 hours each one, one to get there and one to get back home. On a daily average we waste 4 hours just to drop off and pick up our kids from the school. This is merely the time aspect not to mention the monetary aspect. My husband and I both work full time, and I am a part time student, therefore we have had to ask for help from family to accommodate our schedules. The solution offered to us in terms of a Ventra card does not fit our needs as it does not help with my time management nor is it practical for us to provide that transportation to our children as that would take even more time from our already tight schedules. We considered moving our children to a closer school but, there was no school that could offer our children the same quality of education as they are currently receiving at Pulaski. We prepared our children to have the opportunity to be able to attend this school and were willing to sacrifice their time and ours to cut our everyday leisure time. The current situation however worsened those conditions. We would appreciate to be able to return to some sense of normality. |
| 2 | I would like to address the lack of bus services for students at magnet and selective |
| | enrollment schools. For almost a month now, I have been spending on average three to four hours per school day on public transportation just to get my two young children to and from their separate schools. At only a month in, it is already abundantly clear to me that this current arrangement is not sustainable for my family. Not only is this physically draining for my children and myself, but my family will suffer financially as my working hours are shortened to account for the amount of time I spend in transit. Driving my children to school as many families are currently doing is not an option as I have never and likely will never hold a drivers license due to limitations that prevent me from safely operating a motor vehicle. The going rates for private transportation or using Uber every day are simply unaffordable for my family and many families in similar or worst financial situations. With my children being too young to navigate public transit on their own I am left with only three options: 1. Continue what I've been doing what I've been doing, something that looks as though it will be nearly impossible to maintain for the entire school year, especially during winter weather. 2. Drive my family into debt paying for private transportation or ride shares. 3. Send my children to our neighborhood schools - which would mean that my oldest leaves a school with a literacy proficiency rate of 82% to go to school of the literacy proficiency rate of 10% which is less than half of the already low state average. For my youngest, this would mean having to pay tuition at a community based preschool or staying home the rest of the year until she can go also go to the closest public option, where again, 90% of the student population is reading below grade level. |
| | While I would absolutely love it if the state of our public school system was such that anyone living anywhere within the city limits could their child to their neighborhood |

school with confidence that they would get a quality education, this is not the case. Magnet and selective enrollment are often the best case options for many students of color as well as low income students - lack of transportation to those schools limits their access. I would like the board to consider this in hopes they take immediate action to correct it.
